

PERMIT COMPARISON

TABC is doing a study on permits for wineries. They requested Texas Wine Growers and other organizations in the state to provide recommendations for a Farm Winery Permit. The purpose of this comparison sheet is to help highlight the features and differences between the current G Permit (G) and a proposed Farm Winery Permit (FM).
